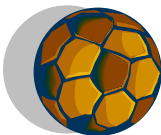
## **Summer Evening Buffet**

The Hopton and District Conservative Association is holding its summer evening buffet at Hepworth Village Hall on Friday 2nd June from 6.30 pm.

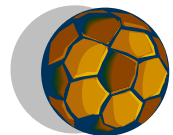

**Stanton** - A unit was broken in to on the Industrial estate at 3am on the 17th but nothing stolen as the alarm went off.

### A Good news Story

Recently there have been incidents where Police officers have contained an area whilst waiting for the arrival of a dog unit. Officers actions and patience have resulted in positive results, an example is as follows:-

On Sunday 23rd April in Ipswich a vehicle failed to stop having reversed at a police officer on foot. The vehicle subsequently crashed and both occupants made off on foot in the Dale Hall Lane area of town. Police helicopter A99 and the duty dog handler were called to attend at an early stage, and a very tight containment was put in place by Police officers. Patrol officers located the passenger from the vehicle, but the containment maintained, awaiting the arrival of the Operations Dept.

The swift co-ordinating of points together with the attendance of the helicopter A99 caused the driver to go to ground, where he was located during a search by the dog unit, having travelled from Lakenheath to attend.

Numerous charges have been brought and a large quantity of drugs have been recovered.

## **Selling a Car?**

News is filtering down from Norfolk where buyers are using counterfeit Bank/Building Society Drafts to purchase vehicles advertised for sale - and sellers are eager to get the money and forgetting to undertake the basic checks before handing over the keys to their car?

If someone presents a Draft please ring the bank/building society there and then to confirm that the draft is genuine get names of people you speak to at the bank.

If possible get an ID with a picture from the buyer and it is suggested that if you have a camera take a picture of the person - the genuine buyer has nothing to worry about the bogus buyer has? Make sure that you get a name and address from the ID preferably a driving licence or a passport if not an utility bill - if this can't be produced then don't hand over the keys until the draft has been cleared as its too late telling the police after you've had the car stolen nor will your insurance company cover the loss as most are now using a clause to cover this type of deliberate theft.

## **Purse Thefts**

There have been a spate of purses taken from elderly ladies' handbags or trolleys in supermarkets in Bury town centre. Usually the victims don't notice that they have been jostled or that their bags have been unzipped.

Keep your purse out of sight and ensure your bag is zipped up at all times.

Wear shoulder bags across the front of your body with the zip/clasp facing inwards.

If someone bumps into you or pushes you – check your bag immediately.

Do NOT leave handbags on shopping trolleys or pushchairs, hold them.

There is a supply of little bells at the police stations free. You can put them on the fastening of your bag or purse and they will jingle if someone opens it.

(When I'm an old lady and live with my kids)

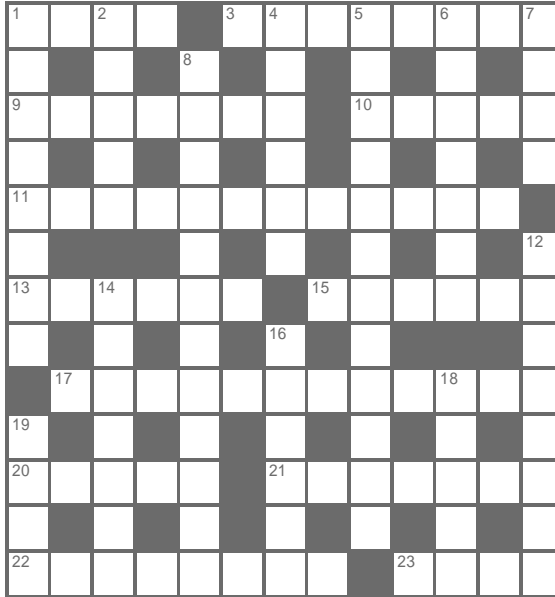
When they cook dinner and call me to eat,

## Notice from the Queen

Has greyed our skies of blue.

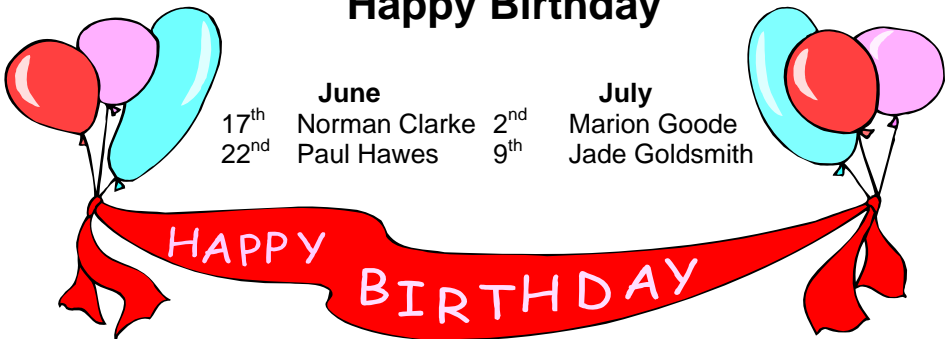
Your poison chokes the silver fish

## **EASY APRICOT CHUTNEY**

### **Ingredients**

250g Organic Dried Apricots

½ tsp Garam Masala

150g Soft Brown Sugar

225ml Malt Vinegar

½ tsp Salt

60g Sultanas

275ml Water

1 tsp Finely Chopped Fresh Ginger (heaped)

Chop up the dried apricots into four pieces and put into saucepan with all other ingredients and bring to the boil. Simmer for approx 45 mins or until the chutney starts to get thick and 'gooey'. Take off heat and allow to cool. Sterilise suitable jar by putting into preheated oven at about 150c for about 10 minutes. Allow jar to cool before adding chutney.
